Outside Kind: Establishing a renewed culture of respect for our public resources and other users.

Outside Kind is sustaining and improving our communities as we face growth and pressure on our existing recreational resources.

- Educate recreational users about ethics to reduce conflict and protect our resources.
- The Gallatin Valley Land Trust the City of Bozeman incorporated • Outside Kind into their strategic plans which establishes a lasting and meaningful impact on promoting ethical behavior in outdoor activities and environmental conservation in the region.
- Bridger Ski Foundation reported 75% fewer calls about bad behavior than past seasons.

RANCH TO TABLE DINNER

ne Montana celebrated the fall harvest season by hosting a fundraising event on September 27. We offered a unique experience where two individuals joined Matt Skoglund of North Bridger Bison for a very personal bison field harvest, where Matt chooses the animal for harvest by observing individual animals for size and age class. The meat was then butchered and divided ,with one-third donated to feed 90 dining guests at Bodhi Farms. The dinner, raffle, silent and live auction helped to raise more than \$47,000 for 1MT, the Master Hunter Program, and Outside Kind.

Building Relationships

Master Hunter Program: Educating effective hunters to support private land management, living with wildlife, and ethical sporting behavior.

- 371 hunters have graduated from the program.
- More than **88% of graduates** say they want to be hunter education instructors and/or mentors as a result of the program, which helps share knowledge and expertise with a wider audience of hunters, extending the program's impact beyond immediate participants.
- Over **70 Master Hunters provided 600+ volunteer hours for 23 on-ranch service projects** to maintain ranching practices that support wildlife habitat and corridors. From 2020 – 2023, Master Hunters volunteered 2,023+ service hours for 73 on-ranch projects.
- Highly rated program by participants: 100% completion of the 2023 Course Survey: 9.1 (10 being the highest) overall program rating, with 9.2 for instructors and 9.4 for 1MT and MHP Staff.

SERVICE PROJECT

aster Hunters gathered at the King Ranch to flag cattle fence with white plastic tags to make them more visible to low-flying sage-grouse. This is part of a large-scale, fence-marking effort in eastern Montana around prime sagegrouse habitat, particularly near leks, or mating grounds. When the low-flying birds are active at dawn or dusk, times of low visibility, they can fly into wire fencing and be injured and even decapitated.
